


COMMUNITY HEALTH NEEDS ASSESSMENT IMPLEMENTATION PLAN

Introduction

Based in Memphis, Tennessee, Methodist Le Bonheur Healthcare (MLH) has been caring for anyone who walks through its doors for more than 100 years. Guided by roots in the United Methodist Church and founded

in 1918 to help meet the growing need for quality healthcare in the greater Memphis area, MLH has grown from one hospital into a comprehensive healthcare system with 13,000 Associates supporting six hospitals, ambulatory surgery centers, outpatient facilities, hospice residence and physician practices serving communities across the Mid-South. From transplants and advanced heart procedures to expert neurology services and compassionate cancer care, MLH offers clinical expertise with a focus on improving every life we touch.



MLH has long stood by its commitment to serve all corners of Mid-South area. This is clear through the physical presence of our hospitals and facilities in every corner of the community, including North, South and Downtown Memphis. MLH has maintained this presence for nearly five decades as part of its commitment to improving the health of our entire community.

In addition to providing nationally recognized clinical care, our commitment to our community's health goes beyond treating those within the walls of our hospitals. We start with our employees — developing programs and initiatives to help our workers manage and improve their health. Through internal entities like the Mission Integration division, MLH continues to develop novel programs to address the needs of the diverse communities it serves.

MLH's most recent 2022 Community Health Needs Assessment (CHNA) studied the needs of the community in MLH's primary service area of Shelby County, Tennessee and Desoto County and Mississippi. The report reaffirmed many of the priorities the system has maintained in recent years and highlighted new opportunities to improve the health of those in Memphis and the Mid-South in conjunction with our Reimagined Strategic Plan. This plan describes how MLH will use insights gained from the CHNA to shape actions and address these community needs.

HEALTH PRIORITIES

MLH's 2022 CHNA reaffirmed priorities from the system's previous 2019 CHNA. The 2022 assessment identified the following priorities:

Cardiovascular Health

Cardiovascular disease (CVD) is the leading cause of death in MLH's service area and cardiovascular patients are among the most common discharges from MLH hospitals. Cardiovascular health has consistently ranked among our system's priority initiatives and will continue to be a leading focus. Conditions related to CVD were among the leading issues identified by the community in CHNA focus groups, including: diabetes, and obesity. Obesity increases the risk of developing cardiovascular disease. Adults with diabetes are more likely to die from heart disease or stroke than adults without diabetes. Given the correlation between CVD, obesity and diabetes, our community health improvement plan is designed to address this need.

Adult Cancer Care

Cancer is the second-leading cause of death in the communities MLH serves. There are significant health disparities related to cancer prevalence and mortality in Shelby and Desoto Counties. In Shelby County, African Americans die from cancer at a rate 1.4 times greater than Caucasians. The majority of patients treated in the MLH system are individuals of color, giving the system a unique opportunity to impact these disparities in cancer outcomes. Research also suggests a direct cause-and-effect connection between obesity and conditions that increase cancer risk such as chronic inflammation and immune suppression. As a result, our community health improvement plan will address this need.

ADDRESSING CARDIOVASCULAR DISEASE AND CANCER

Memphis ranks as the 2nd most obese city in the United States and because obesity is a major risk factor for both cardiovascular disease and cancer, MLH will directly address these two identified needs through a community wide focus on healthy lifestyles and weight loss. This effort will also put extra focus in areas of our community with the highest risk and disparity.

Healthier 901 – Powered by MLH

In fall 2023, MLH will launch a community-wide campaign challenging Mid-Southerners to lose weight. This challenge will aim to tackle obesity, which is a main contributing factor to heart disease and cancer. MLH will drive engagement to our program with an emphasis on areas in our community most affected by obesity. This challenge will have a specific weight loss goal for those in our community which will be tracked over a period of time to assess how well we achieve our goal in the designated time period. MLH will announce the full details of the campaign in the coming months.

ADRESSING OTHER COMMUNITY NEEDS

While our main focus is on impacting cardiovascular disease and cancer through a community effort addressing healthy lifestyles and weight loss, we recognize that there are many other community needs that were identified through the assessment. MLH is committed to addressing these needs as well. MLH has a vast portfolio of programs and partnerships currently in place that address many of the other needs identified from the CHNA. For example, mental health, community violence, poverty and access to healthcare as outlined in figure 1A (next page).
