According to Literacy Mid-South, 78.6% of 3rd graders in Shelby County Schools read below grade level, and 70% of incarcerated individuals read below a 3rd grade reading level. It is a tremendous problem in our community, and has far-reaching consequences. Additionally, literacy rates are proven indicators of future health outcomes in individuals and communities. As we move towards the start of a new school year, we are aware that children have been away from classrooms for months longer than ever before, and they need tools that can accelerate their progress towards their educational goals.

At MLH: Working together with our Methodist Healthcare Foundation, Shelby County Schools, and The Urban Child Institute, MLH has been running BookNook at sites all over Memphis for the past 12 months. BookNook is a cloud-based technology platform that improves literacy skills for children of all ages. BookNook has been implemented in after-school programs at churches and community centers, and the results have been incredible. This past summer, 95% of students who used BookNook improved or maintained their reading level, and during the school year, the average student gained the equivalent of 1.3 grade levels in reading aptitude.
