

A GIFT FOR THE FUTURE

The Teresa and Keith O'Neill Hospice Endowment Helps Ensure the Future of Methodist Hospice Residence

After partnering with Methodist Le Bonheur Healthcare personally and professionally for more than 30 years, Teresa and Keith O'Neill felt compelled to do more for the healthcare system that had done so much for them.

"We know firsthand the quality of care Methodist Le Bonheur Healthcare provides to every patient in their facilities because so much of our lives have been intertwined with MLH. I met my wife at Methodist. Our children were born at Methodist. The system served as the lifeblood of my career in healthcare food service," said Keith, retired CEO of Hospital Housekeeping Services (HHS) at Methodist Le Bonheur Healthcare.

Due to their long history of partnership and support, the O'Neills knew that designating their gift to the Methodist Hospice Residence would make a significant impact on the lives of some of the system's most vulnerable patients. The Methodist Hospice Residence was established to address the holistic — physical, emotional and spiritual — well-being of those who are terminally ill and their families, regardless of their circumstances.

"I have always heard 'give back to those who give to you,' and I truly could not think of a more deserving partner to give to than Methodist Le Bonheur Healthcare," Keith said.

Since the Residence opened in 2011, as a result of the generosity of donors like the O'Neills, Methodist Hospice caregivers have provided more than 62,331 days of care, worth \$4.1 million, to patients who were uninsured or unable to pay.

Inspired by this need and aiming to impact the future of the Methodist Hospice Residence, the O'Neills chose to make a transformational gift of \$500,000 in 2022 to launch the Teresa and Keith O'Neill Hospice Endowment.

"It is both humbling and truly gratifying to know that we can help bridge the gap to provide compassionate end-of-life care for those who may not otherwise be able to afford it. Everyone deserves to be cared for and comforted and to pass with dignity in a peaceful environment," Teresa said.

Over the next two years, the Methodist Healthcare Foundation's goal is to partner with donors to raise an additional \$2.5 million for a total endowment of \$3 million.

"A gift to the O'Neill Endowment serves as an investment in Methodist Hospice's legacy and future of compassion, comfort and care for those in their precious last days," said Joey Maurizi, director of development at the Methodist Healthcare Foundation.

Adams Family Celebrates New Life and Exceptional Care Through Circles of Joy Campaign

Built in 2010, The Pavilion at Methodist Le Bonheur Germantown Hospital provides high-quality, safe care to expecting and new moms and their babies in a comfortable, beautiful and safe space.

Seeking to add beauty and to raise support for The Pavilion at Methodist Le Bonheur Germantown Hospital, the Methodist Healthcare Foundation created the Circles of Joy artistic installation in the lobby of The Pavilion and outside the entrance to the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU).

Each display includes circles of various sizes, artfully displayed, to recognize donors for their gifts.

Sara and Kevin Adams were among the first to donate to the Circles of Joy campaign.

"After our first precious granddaughter was born one month early in 2018, we were really nervous and didn't know what to expect. The Pavilion staff was amazing, professional, thorough and patient with the baby, her parents and even her worried grandparents," said Sara. "When granddaughter number two arrived in 2019, we were so comfortable coming up to the NICU to see her. Our third granddaughter arrived during COVID. While we were not able to visit, we were so confident in the care she was receiving."

In December 2022, the Adams family gathered at The Pavilion to view their personalized circle honoring their three granddaughters. The gratitude from each family member was palpable.

"We are thrilled to express our gratitude for the fabulous Methodist NICU staff and support care for future families who may need NICU services," Sara said. "We saw firsthand the quality of care and dedication provided by Methodist Le Bonheur. Through our gift, we want to help ensure that these facilities are here to help other families should they find themselves in the same position."

Donations to the Circles of Joy campaign ensure that quality labor and delivery, antepartum, postpartum and newborn care are accessible in our community. Gifts to this fund are invested in much-needed resources, including cutting-edge technology, updated equipment and facility improvements that help keep our hospital on the forefront of maternal and pediatric care. This fund also provides education opportunities for staff and community members and support resources for families in need at The Pavilion. It also supports the NICU family reunion event for patients, parents and staff every five years.

Donors are invited to sponsor a Circle of Joy in celebration of a birth, to honor loved ones or to express gratitude to caregivers. Gifts to this fund can be made monthly, annually or as a one-time donation to help provide access to expert, quality care for generations to come.

PARTNERSHIP WITH PURPOSE

Vitalant's Support Gets to the Heart of Shared Mission: Helping Patients

The partnership between Methodist Le Bonheur Healthcare and lifesaving blood services provider, Vitalant became even stronger in 2022, with the launch of the inaugural Sips for Sickle Cell event, a fun and interactive gathering benefiting the Methodist Healthcare Comprehensive Sickle Cell Center. Vitalant served as the new event's presenting sponsor.

As one of the largest nonprofit blood services organizations, Vitalant's dedicated team works to ensure that lifesaving blood is available when and where it is needed in the Mid-South and across the United States.

Vitalant and Methodist have a long history of partnership through shared missions. In addition to their presenting sponsorship for Sips for Sickle Cell, Vitalant hosted blood drives across the MLH system and supported Sickle Cell Awareness Month activities throughout September 2022.

With this generous support, Sips for Sickle Cell, which featured HGTV design star **Carmeon Hamilton** as celebrity host, raised vital funding and awareness for the Methodist Sickle Cell Center and the patients it serves.

Supporting areas of care like sickle cell treatment aligns seamlessly with Vitalant's mission and work. Individuals living with sickle cell disease rely on blood transfusions as an important therapeutic intervention that increases the oxygen carrying capacity of their blood and reduces complications. On average, people living with sickle cell disease need up to 100 units of blood per year.

"We are proud to further our partnership with Methodist Le Bonheur Healthcare and its Foundation," said David Williams, regional director at Vitalant. "We believe in this mission and want to do all that we can to ensure that blood is ready in the hospital whenever it is needed—not just after major disasters, but also for the everyday personal emergencies and ongoing medical needs of hundreds of patients in our community."

In October, Vitalant's local staff members organized a donation of beautiful blankets, wrapped with handwritten notes of encouragement, and delivered them to patients receiving treatment at the Methodist Cancer Institute.

For safety reasons, Methodist Le Bonheur Healthcare does not use blood or other biologic products from paid donors. Therefore, Vitalant's volunteer donors are vital to the healthcare system and the patients we serve.

Williams said, "When community members choose to give blood with Vitalant, they are helping hospital patients within our community and, when the need arises, others across the country."

Vitalant's support and partnership with the Methodist Healthcare Foundation serves as a shining example of mission-aligned, inspired philanthropy that results in greater impact and a brighter future for the organizations and community as a whole.

In 2022, the Methodist Healthcare Foundation launched the 1918 Society to recognize individual donors who have contributed \$100,000 or more throughout their lifetimes. The new society aims to honor the generosity and commitment of those donor partners whose contributions significantly benefit the faith-based, healing mission of Methodist Le Bonheur Healthcare.

The inaugural induction of donors to the 1918 Society took place on September 29, 2022 with a reception hosted by former MLH chief executive officer, Gary Shorb and his wife, Glenda. The Shorbs were also inducted into the society in recognition of their longstanding support. New members will be inducted each fall.

"Our Foundation team and board are so honored to be able to formally recognize this inspiring list of donors for their lifetime giving," said Zach Pretzer, president of the Methodist Healthcare Foundation. "Together, the 55 members of this society have donated more than \$51 million to the Methodist Healthcare Foundation and impacted the lives of countless patients."

In addition to the 1918 Society, three other Methodist Healthcare Foundation giving societies were created in 2022 to honor donors:

- The Sherard Society-for those who have donated to the Foundation for more than 20 years consecutively.
- The Elliot Society-for those who have made provisions for the Foundation in their estate planning.
- Partners in Philanthropy-representing companies, organizations and foundations who have supported the Foundation for 5, 10, 15 and 20 years consecutively.

"We hope that the creation of these donor societies will provide meaningful recognition for our most generous donors and will also ensure that they are aware of the tremendous impact they have had," said Pretzer.

Methodist Transplant Institute Completes 328 Life-Saving Organ Transplants

The nationally recognized solid organ transplantation program at the Methodist Transplant Institute performed 328 life-saving organ transplants in 2022, raising the bar in transplant patient care.

The Institute, located at Methodist University Hospital, offers kidney, liver and pancreas transplants to adults, as well as pediatric kidney and liver transplants in partnership with Le Bonheur Children's Hospital.

A state-of-the-art facility renowned for broad success with liver, kidney and pancreas transplants, the Institute currently has 10,000 new and existing patients, with another 800 on the waitlist.

In addition, in 2022, Methodist Le Bonheur Healthcare also celebrated the appointment of the former surgical director, Jason Vanatta, MD, as the new program director of the Methodist Transplant Institute.


"Dr. Vanatta is an exceptional surgeon with a distinguished career spanning two decades," said Michael Ugwueke, MPH, DHA, FACHE, president and CEO of Methodist Le Bonheur Healthcare. "His engaging style of leading from behind to drive collaboration and innovation, coupled with a passion and commitment to eliminating health disparities in our community, will help ensure our transplant program continues to deliver high-quality care to anyone who enters our doors."

Dr. Vanatta has a finely honed vision for how to move the Institute forward in its goal of improving the quality of life and life expectancy of organ transplant patients.

The team is working to expand patient education, access to care and social support services in order to provide a truly holistic model of care that addresses the physical, social, spiritual and emotional needs of the patients and their families.

Through the Transplant Resource Center Fund at the Methodist Healthcare Foundation, donors are helping bring this vision to life, providing financial resources to help the Institute assist patients and families with transportation, housing, food and medication needs before, during and after their transplant surgeries.


LIVING WELL NETWORK MENTAL HEALTH BREAKFAST
