#### **BECOMING A PATIENT**

To become a patient of the Methodist Comprehensive Sickle Cell Center, schedule an appointment at our preventive clinic, so that we can get a full picture of your medical history. After your first appointment, you can use the infusion center for crisis care.



## **TIPS**

Here are a few helpful tips for your visits to the infusion center:

- For mild or early onset crisis, we provide IV fluid hydration and pain management. IF AT ALL POSSIBLE, DO NOT WAIT UNTIL YOUR PAIN IS SEVERE.
- Before you arrive, call us at 901.516.8785 or **901.516.8188**, and let us know you are on your way. This will allow us to care for you more quickly.
- Please make arrangements to be driven to and from the Center. You should not drive or operate any dangerous machinery for at least 24-hours after receiving medications.
- If you believe you are in severe crisis with other symptoms such as chest pain, shortness of breath or severe cough, go immediately to the nearest Emergency Room.
