PGY2 Emergency Medicine Residency



Overview

Methodist University Hospital offers an ASHP-accredited postgraduate year two (PGY-2) residency in Emergency Medicine Pharmacy Practice. The purpose of the Emergency Medicine PGY2 residency program is to build upon Doctor of Pharmacy (PharmD) education and PGY1 pharmacy residency training to develop pharmacist practitioners with knowledge, skills, and abilities as defined in the educational competency areas, goals, and objectives for advanced practice areas. Residents who successfully complete our PGY2 residency programs are prepared for advanced patient care or other specialized positions, and board certification in the advanced practice area, if available. Additionally the residency program will provide residents with the knowledge, skills and attitudes required to achieve potential excellence as clinician, educator and scholar in the area of emergency medicine. Our institution is home to a 58-bed Emergency Department that sees approximately 75,000 patients per year. In addition, our institution has a 16-bed medical/surgical intensive care unit (ICU), 16-bed cardiovascular ICU, 16-bed neurocritical care unit, and 16-bed transplant ICU. Residents have the opportunity to complete a Trauma rotation at an off-site institution in downtown Memphis. Residents are expected to perform independently and demonstrate proficiency in their rotations. The residency preceptor provides guidance and assistance to the resident and ensures that the goals set forth by the resident and the program is met. The preceptor also provides the resident with frequent evaluation of their progress, including a written evaluation at the conclusion of the rotation. All residents are expected to demonstrate self-initiative, independent learning skills, and effective communication skills throughout the residency. Frequent, clear communication is the key to a successful resident / preceptor relationship.

Program Expectations

- Provide clinical pharmacy services to patients in the emergency department
- Co-precept pharmacy students and PGY1 residents
- Initiate, complete, and present a practice-based research project at a regional or national meeting, as well as submit for publication
- Provide effective medication education to patients, caregivers, and healthcare personnel
- Develop and deliver educational presentations to a variety of audience types
- Support hospital and pharmacy quality and safety initiatives
- Successfully achieve a minimum of 75% of all required residency learning objectives

- Acute Stroke
- Trauma ICU (offsite - Regional One Health)

- Medical ICU (If not already experienced as a Critical Care Selective)
- Antimicrobial Stewardship

- On-Call (approximately 2-3 weeks per year)
- Medication Use Policy & Safety (3 months)
